Title IX Report - September 2, 2022 through August 31, 2023

Trustee Wyatt made motion to approve the Consent Calendar and was seconded by Trustee Atkeisson. All in favor / none opposed.

Board Recognition

The Board of Trustees recognized Mr. John Dawley for being inducted into the Agriculture Teachers Hall of Fame. Dr. Fegan commented about how important Mr. Dawley is to the College and the program. Chairman Judson commented to Mr. Dawley; think about all the lives you have touched over the years with your teaching. The Board of Trustees, Dr. Fegan, Dr. Johnson and Dr. Peters recognized Mr. Dawley with a certificate and pictures were taken. Mr. Dawley commented that he is glad he chose to come to Navarro College and said it was the best decision he made and is honored to be inducted into the Agriculture Teachers Hall of Fame along with his brother and to be associated with the organization.

Update on Enrollment

Vice President Sina Ruiz presented the update. No action is required.

For Fall 2023 census date of September 14, 2023 semester credit hours are 59,765 compared to Fall 2022 of 59,031 which is up by 1.24% or 734 semester credit hours. The 10-year headcount trend is up in all areas and dual credit is now 40% of enrollment and the highest in the last 10 years. The projected Fall 2023 total housing revenue is \$2,272,048 but the actual revenue is \$2,100,488 due to housing 603 students versus 651. The Spring 2024 enrollment update as of September 27, 2023 which includes Fall 2nd 8-week, Winter Mini, Spring 16-week, and Spring 1st 8-week is up 9.64%

Finance and Operations - Review Preliminary August 2023 Financial Statement

Vice President Teresa Thomas presented the Preliminary August 2023 Financial Statement. No action is required Budget amendments for August 2023 totaled \$377,233 which consisted of \$376,000 from fund balance for Waxahachie parking lots, and \$1,233 was moved to auxiliary for gift shop inventory increases.

As of August 2023, we have received 84.11% of the Academic student income budgeted for 2022-23, 115.15% of Continuing Education Student Income; 115.24% of local appropriations, and 78.66% of total General Operating and Grant Budgets. The Auxiliary fund earned 78.49% of the revised budget as of August 2023.

Total year to date expenses for the Education and General Fund are lower than August 2022 by \$5,068,586. State, Federal and Local grants were \$9,171,771 lower in August 2023 from August 2022 as a result of all the HEERF funds being almost completed. Other expenditures increased in total from the same time last year by \$5,163,378. Fund Balance appropriations of \$5,501,989 and lost revenue appropriations of \$2,493,129 account for increases in expenditures during 2023. Included in the fund balance appropriations are \$100,000 to TASB, \$81,560 to CEI, \$469,191 to Oracle, \$2,310,203 for turf, \$1,219,490 for IT, \$182,000 for police cars; \$935,895 for parking lots, \$45,000 for storage containers, \$68,650 for fencing around turf field, and lost revenue of \$2,493,129.14 for equipment and various construction projects.

As of August 2023, the total E&G revenue before HEERF dollars is lower by \$4,562,467 from the same time in August 2022. Academic Student Revenue is lower by \$157,835, Continuing Education is higher by \$36,717, local appropriations higher by \$665,482, and state appropriations are lower by \$724,668. The Federal revenue is lower by \$4,915,890, and State Grant revenue is higher by \$342,555 from August 2022.

A comparison of the year-to-date revenue budget for August 2023 to the actual month to date revenue for August 2023 shows that from our amended budget, we still have \$11,490,229 of revenue to collect, however, over \$7 million is in the budget for appropriations from fund balance and lost revenue and that will not be in actual dollars because those dollars were collected in previous years. Grant funds will be collected when they are drawn down, and state funds will get collected as we are paid by the state. Resource allocations for the general fund show that we have not spent \$6,442,815 of the revised budget in General Operating, and \$839,702 of the auxiliary budget. The net difference of income to expenses from E& G is 5,047,414 short of budget and \$1,355,940 short in auxiliary for a total between the two funds of \$6,403,354 short of budget as of August 2023.

Consider Action on Investment Report for Quarter Ended August 31, 2023

Quarterly Investment Report for quarter ended August 31, 2023 shows one CD was renewed for \$500,000 with Citizens State Bank at 5.25%. The total book value was \$2,475,000 and market value of \$2,525,666. The investment report shows \$1,745,000 is in E&G fund, \$500,000 in Debt Service Fund, and \$230,00 in Student Financial Aid Fund. The pledged collateral report shows we had total deposits of \$25,831,100 and were collateralized with \$1,250,000 of FDIC coverage and \$38,796,377 of pledged mortgage backed securities.

Trustee Aldama made motion to approve the Investment Report for Quarter Ended August 31, 2023 and second by Trustee Seely. All in favor / none opposed.
